

Introducing Irish Design Afternoon Tea at The Westbury The Year of Irish Design

Dublin's luxury hotel renowned for supporting art, culture and design launches Irish Design Afternoon Tea in support of their corporate partnership with Irish Design 2015

In a city known for its beautiful art and culture, Dublin's Westbury Hotel has created Irish Design Afternoon Tea to mark a year long celebration of Irish Design in 2015. Guests enjoying the beautiful surrounds of The Gallery, which features one of Ireland's foremost private art collections, will now be able to relax and enjoy a truly creative afternoon tea inspired by the work of local Irish makers.

The tea includes a collection of beautifully handcrafted pastries, cakes and sandwiches, paying homage to some of Ireland's top designers and craftspeople inspired by PORTFOLIO: Critical Selection 2015-2016 published by the Design & Crafts Council of Ireland. The biennial publication features the best of Irish contemporary design and craft in a world-class context in order to increase awareness and understanding of top Irish makers and their work.

The Westbury Hotel's executive pastry chef Tatjana Upelniece-Kiselova has taken her artistic vision from the work of five Irish makers to create our Irish Design Afternoon Tea including; a sumptuous Earl Grey cheesecake served on a crunchy base which emulates Karl Harron's glasswork titled *Migration Reactive Bullseye*, while the sour cream mousse with blackberry cremoux echoes Angela O'Kelly's *Long Round Sculputral Neckpiece*.

Cillian O'Súilleabháin's *Tetrahedra* chest of drawers in walnut and ash has inspired a chocolate éclair with lemon curd, while a dulcey panna cotta, mango and banana caramel pot is inspired by *Ash Footed Vessel* by internationally renowned woodturner Liam Flynn. The delicious blueberry rollage, chocolate and mascarpone Chantilly has been influenced by ceramic designer Jack Doherty's *Duo Porcelain*.

Speaking about the partnership and afternoon tea Karen Hennessy, Chief Executive of Irish Design 2015 commented; "We are delighted to be working with The Doyle Collection and The Westbury Hotel as part of this year long celebration of Irish Design. The Doyle Collection's support of art and culture made them an ideal accommodation partner. In particular, I am excited to see how the work of Irish designers and makers has inspired the creation of the Irish Design Afternoon Tea; this in itself is another example of how design infiltrates all areas of our lives. The use of different ingredients to develop textures, colours and shapes which echo the work of Irish designers and makers is an artistic achievement in itself."

Tatjana Upelniece-Kiselova, pastry chef at The Westbury Hotel described how she enjoyed working on this project; "As a chef it is fantastic to have the opportunity to work with established Irish designers. Taking inspiration from jewellery, to woodwork, to porcelain and glasswork we used a range of ingredients and techniques to create a truly bespoke afternoon tea that showcased the best of Irish design."
