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salmon served with their signature Guinness bread (£11). An array of main dishes include Salcombe crab & crayfish ravioli with crayfish, cavolo nero and parmesan gremolata (£19), Herb crusted new season lamb rump with goats curd champ and spring pea purée (£24) and Arborio risotto with spring vegetables, edamame, wild garlic leaf and parmesan shavings (£18).

For guests looking for a lighter option a selection of salads will be available including the Superfood Salad consisting of quinoa, beetroot, feta, edamame, sunflowers seeds, mint and coriander with pomegranate dressing (£12) alongside a small plates menu taking inspiration from an English spring-time barbeque. Highlights include mini pulled lamb burgers with mint jam and feta (£9) and Grilled tiger prawns with harissa aioli and lemon (£8). Dalloway Terrace will also be offering a selection of desserts that will ensure to satisfy guests with a sweet tooth. These include Hot 70% chocolate mousse served with Irish Cream ice cream (£8), Lemon tart with marinated raspberries (£7.50) and Banana 'split' with chilli, chocolate and lime chantilly and mango sorbet (£7.50). Also on offer will be the new POP range – a selection of premium alcoholic Ice popsicles.

Dalloway Terrace is delighted to be collaborating with Hendrick's Gin to create a menu of refreshing cocktails, ideal for the approaching summer season. Highlights include *Rosie – Hendrick's Gin, rose bud, Champagne* (13), *Cucumber Sour – Hendrick's Gin, Cocchi Rosa, cucumber syrup, lemon, egg white* (£11) and *Bramble – Hendrick's Gin, basil syrup, lemon, Crème de Mure* (£11). The extensive cocktail menu also features a low-ABV and low refined sugar selection of healthy cocktails such as *Elizabeth – Seedlip Garden, Chase Elderflower, mint, dried peas, cucumber, soda* (£11) and *I Love You (Richard Dalloway) – Kamm & Sons, Seedlip Spice, pink grapefruit shrub, agave, lemon, egg white* (£12). Welcoming the warming evenings, Dalloway Terrace will also be bringing back #DallowayFilmClub, showcasing an array of movies through wireless headphones and a 30-foot screen. The offering will include a selection of dishes that can be ordered from the Dalloway Film Club Menu paired with a bespoke cocktail inspired by the film being shown (more details to follow).
